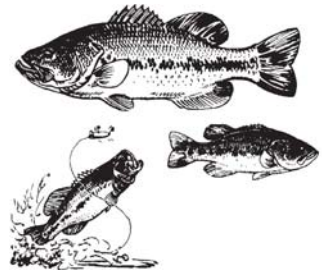

2009 CAMP FEES

Scout, Dining Hall Plan	\$250 (\$240 with discount)
Scout, Patrol Cooking	\$195 (\$185 with discount)
Adult, Dining Hall	\$100
Adult, Patrol Cooking	\$50
Campsite Deposit	\$100 (Applied to total fees)
Provisional Camper	\$275 (\$265 with discount)

Includes transportation to and from camp.



DISCOUNTS

Each scout (youth) who has all payments in on time will receive the \$10 discount. All deadlines must be met to receive the discount. Mailed payments must be postmarked before the due date. Webelos joining a troop after May 15th deadline may still be eligible for the discount if their fees are paid in full by June 1st. Payments made after June 1st will be assessed a late fee of \$25 added to the regular rates of \$250, \$195 and \$275.

CAMPERSHIPS

Camperships are available for Chief Okemos Council scouts. The maximum amount of a campership given will be one half of the discounted fee (\$120, \$92.50 or \$130) depending on the program selected. Campership request forms are available on-line and at the council office. Requests are due at the council office by April 10, 2009.

CAMPSITES AT NORTHWOODS

Inpost sites - on north side of Lake Arrowhead

Algonquin - 24 spaces, close to the dining hall and flag field

Blackfoot - 24 spaces, across from campfire bowl

Chippewa North - 18 spaces, close to Loon Road showers

Chippewa South - 12 spaces a small site, close to parking lot

Delaware - 30 spaces, nice wooded area, centrally located

Erie - 24 spaces, secluded site

Fox - 24 spaces, centrally located to program areas

Huron - 34 spaces, large site with room for extra tents

Iroquois - 34 spaces, large secluded site

Mohawk - 30 spaces, the only site by the lakeshore

Ottawa - 20 spaces, closest site to Shooting Sports

Potawatomi - 24 spaces, secluded site

Outpost sites - east and south side of Lake Arrowhead

Baden Powell - 28 spaces, great view of the lake, on the east shore

Dan Beard - 16 spaces, on the east shore of Lake Arrowhead

Kit Carson - 30 spaces, large site with room for extra tents, on the south shore

Dan Boone - 24 spaces, on the south shore of Lake Arrowhead

All campsites contain wooden platforms with canvas wall tents. Two cots with mattresses are in each tent. Campsites have a fire ring, flag pole, bulletin board, picnic tables and latrine. Inpost campsites have running water and wash-stands, outpost sites are served by water pumps.



MAP TO NORTHWOODS



From Lansing (all distances are approximate):

Take US 127 north to the I69 exit.

Take I-69 east toward Flint/Port Huron, 43 miles

Take the I-75/US-23 exit, number 133 and go north to Saginaw 85.5 miles

Take the M-33 exit number 202 north to Alger/Rose City 10 miles

Turn east (right) on M-55 toward Tawas City to Henderson Lake Road, 6 miles

Turn North (left) on Henderson Lake Road to Peters Road, 4 miles

Turn east (right) on Peters Road to Lakeshore Drive, 1 mile

Turn north (left) on Lakeshore Drive to camp entrance, 0.1 miles

Approximate Total Distance: 161 miles

Approximate travel time: 3 hours 15 minutes
